
Military Moms Prayer Group open to anyone who wants to pray

"I had this divine nudge to start a prayer group," said Pam Proctor, inspired military mother of Capt. Michael Proctor and wife of Bill Proctor, former Marine JAG officer in Vietnam.

And in August 2006, the nudge got stronger, so she and four other women got together and prayed for their children in the military and they called it Military Moms Prayer Group.

Then, one by one, people started to join them and now, they open their doors to anyone who wants to pray.

They are inter-denominational. They have no rules.

"We do two things — we pray and we send packages. That's our mission," said Proctor. "And then we turn our problems over to God."
